The outcome achieved by the end of the year 2010-11.

1. Infrastructure:

- i. Ground floor of professional course building was completed.

First floor is in progress.

- ii. Construction of women's hostel.

Ground floor and first floor were completed. Second floor is in progress.

2. Academic:

- i. A special committee was formed to analyze the reasons for high dropout and average quality performance. The reasons were ascertained e.g. poor attendance, financial problems, farm work and problems in book issuing timings of library. All these problems were mostly solved and the dropout rate was reduced.
- ii. Proposals for research projects were sent.

3. I T:

- i. Six computers of higher configuration were purchased.
- ii. Teachers were given training of MSCIT.

4. Office:

- i. The non teaching staff was given training for operation of small Xerox machine, computer and fax.
- ii. Complete computerization of admission process was done.

5. Library:

- i. Use of Bar code reader gun for issuing books was started.
- ii. Students were motivated to utilize maximum number of books.
- iii. Library books exhibition was organized for students to let them know about academic books, references and books of their interest.

6. Gymkhana:

- i. The motivation to the students resulted in formation of 10 efficient teams of students.
- ii. Both in the morning and evening sessions, maximum number of students started participating in ground activities
- iii. The grants of UGC for buying equipment were sanctioned.

7. Development of campus:

- i. Under the *Green Nagar* scheme of Maharashtra Government 1000 trees were planted in college campus.

- ii. On the birthday of Hon. Sharadraoji Pawar, 72 new plants were planted in campus.
- iii. 100 coconut trees were planted.
- iv. Renovation of 27 flowering beds was completed.
- v. Besides, coloring trunks of trees, plantation of *Croton* and *Palm* in 100 earthen pots were completed.

Under the earn and learn scheme 57 students undertook the responsibilities of tree plantation, campus cleaning, maintenance of ground and gardens, library work, removing weeds and thorny bushes from the campus assistance in office work and maintenance in vermicompost. Due to this economical backward students could get financial benefits.
