Part A:

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year

A1) The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year 2011-12 towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year

Plan of Action:

1. To strengthen the tutor-ward system and parent-teacher association.
2. To look after the welfare needs of teaching and non-teaching.
3. To conduct additional tests and exams for improvement of results at F.Y.B.Sc.level.
4. To purchase advanced level equipments.
5. To start instant ID issuing system.
6. To make effective use of Biometry system.

A2) Outcomes achieved by the end of the year :

1. To strengthen the tutor-ward system a special committee was established. The members of the committee were class teachers, heads of the department and vice-principals. Every member of the teaching faculty was entrusted with the task of mentoring 20 students. For each such group, 4 meetings were held by the tutor teacher, 2 in each term. This provided the students necessary platform to express their grievances, their expectations, their drawbacks and their overall feedback about the institution. The summary of all such meetings was conveyed to the Head of the institution and he could find out certain solutions on bus timing issue, library books issuing and timing, drinking water, sports activities etc.

Under the parent teacher association, parents meetings were held in the campus and parents could interact with the teachers. They could know the performance of their ward, the absentees of their wards. This helped in developing healthy atmosphere between institutions and parents which is the prime need of education.

2. To look after the welfare needs of teaching and non-teaching, the Sevak-Welfare fund was raised. In emergency conditions provision is made for instant contribution by all the staff members for the needy. For non-teaching

staff camp was held for personality development. The teaching faculty is given the opportunity to attend seminars workshops and orientation courses. The teaching faculty is also encouraged for research.

3. As per the suggestion of NAAC for improving the academic performance at F.Y level additional tests were conducted. To determine the academic status of these students, a casual test was conducted for all the three faculties. On the basis of the status report, students were categorized into different cadres such as weak, mediocre and bright etc. This helped the teachers to formulate different policies to handle these students. Accordingly different tests like oral, written, seminars were organized for the students.
4. Specially to cater to the needs of P.G and Research students of Chemistry and Physics, state of the art equipments were purchased reference of which is given in question 27 technologies up gradation.
5. Possession of ID is a very intrinsic demand of any educational institute. For institute of this magnitude, ID issuing becomes a time consuming process. Therefore the institution purchased instruments and necessary accessories to make this task instant.
6. A sophisticated bio-metric system has been installed in the office to document the arrival and departure timings of the staff. This helps in better regulating the time discipline and ensuring punctuality.

Part B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution-

Under the Earn and learn scheme, 56 students undertook the responsibility of tree plantation, campus cleaning, maintenance of ground and gardens, library work and assistance in office work. Due to this economically backward students could get financial assistance which proves education through Self Help Is Our Motto.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction-

The sole responsibility of designing the curriculum rests with the University of Pune. Nevertheless, the BOS members of our college can participate in the above activity. Through them suggestions are conveyed to the University regarding the desirable and undesirable parts of syllabus and accordingly the university adds or deletes parts of the same.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started-

1. The environment awareness course was run for S.Y.B.A, S.Y.B.COM and S.Y.B.Sc. and a common test was conducted for all the above mentioned classes.
2. MS-CIT course was made compulsory for teachers and students who had not completed it before.
3. Soft-skills was run for students of all faculties.
4. Since most of the sciences have become inter-disciplinary like Zoology, Botany, Chemistry teachers of these subjects help each other in completing the relevant topics in the different syllabi of different classes.

5. Examination reforms implemented

1. Separate internal tests were held for students who participated in NCC, NSS, games and other competitions.
2. Grievances regarding internal evaluation were redressed by the concerned teachers.
3. Extra tests were conducted at F.Y. level of all the three faculties to improve their performance at senior college threshold.
4. A special internal squad was appointed to prevent students from indulging in malpractices if any.
